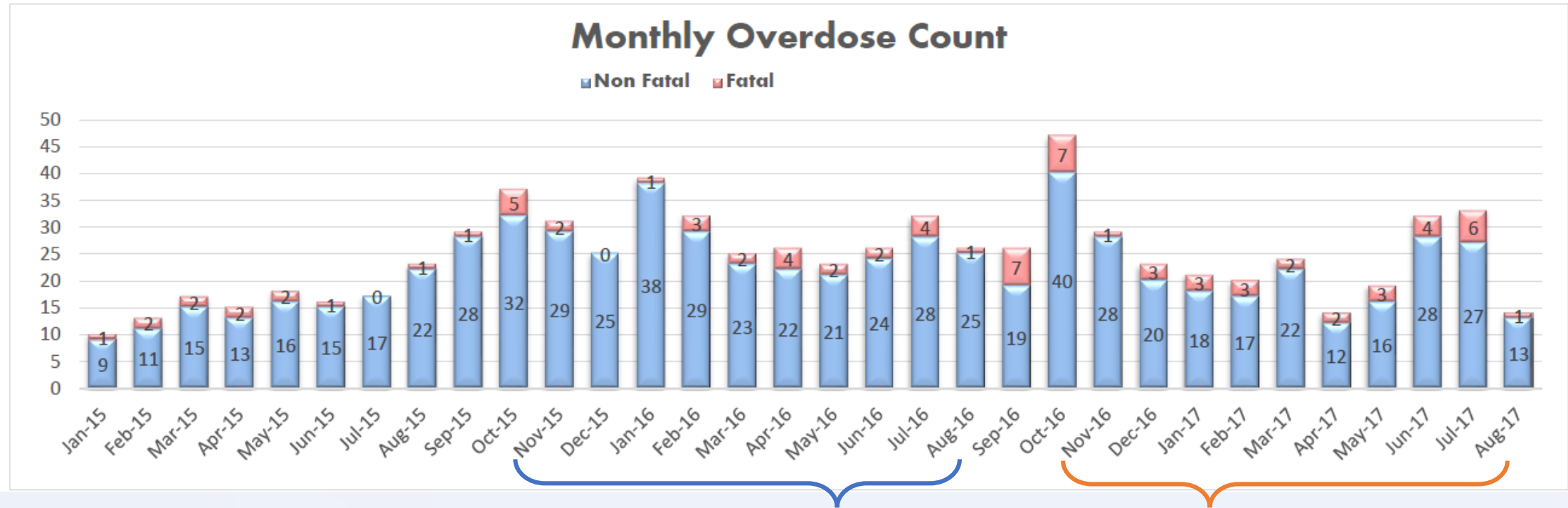

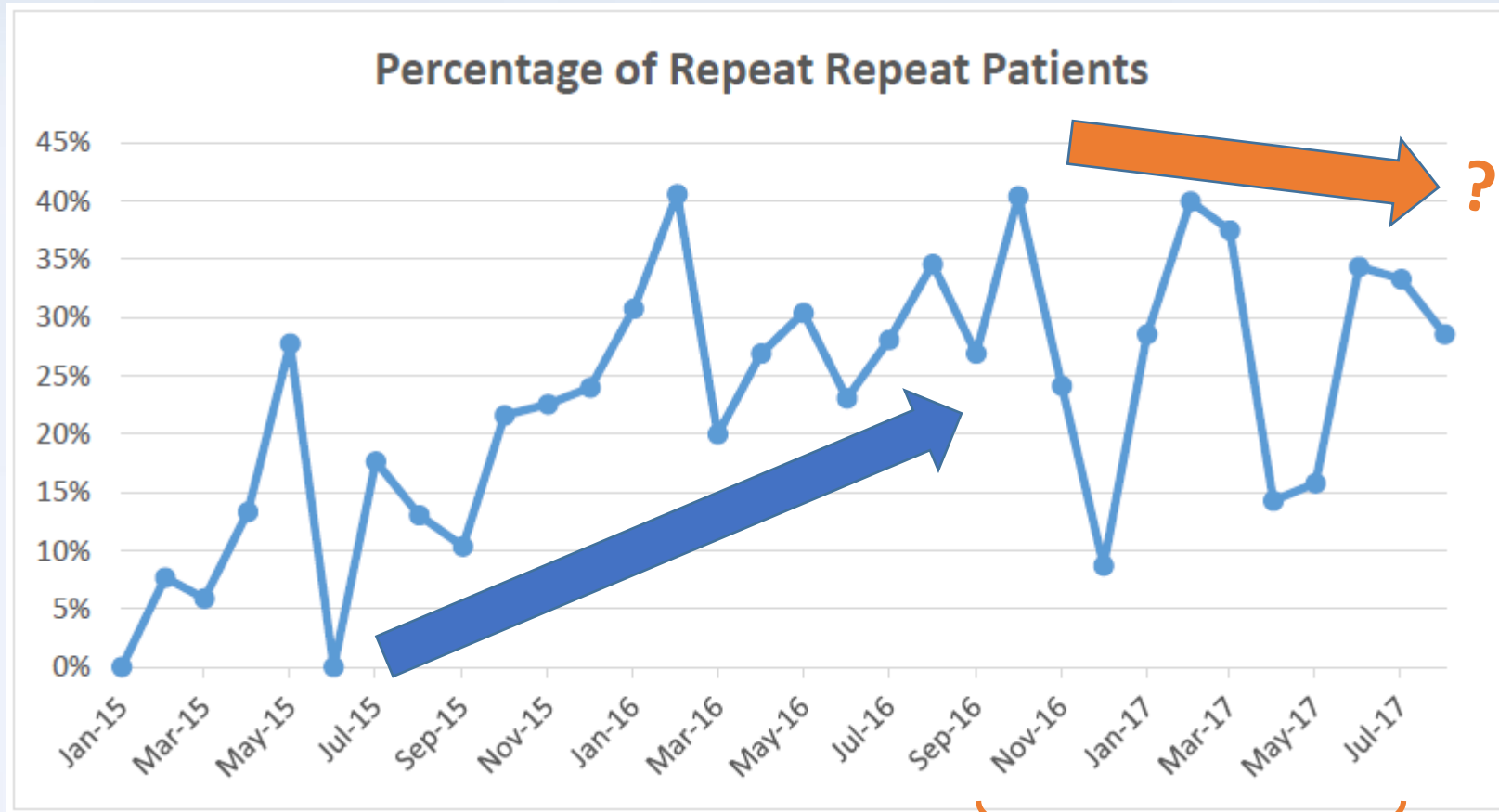

Criteria to Access Family Stat



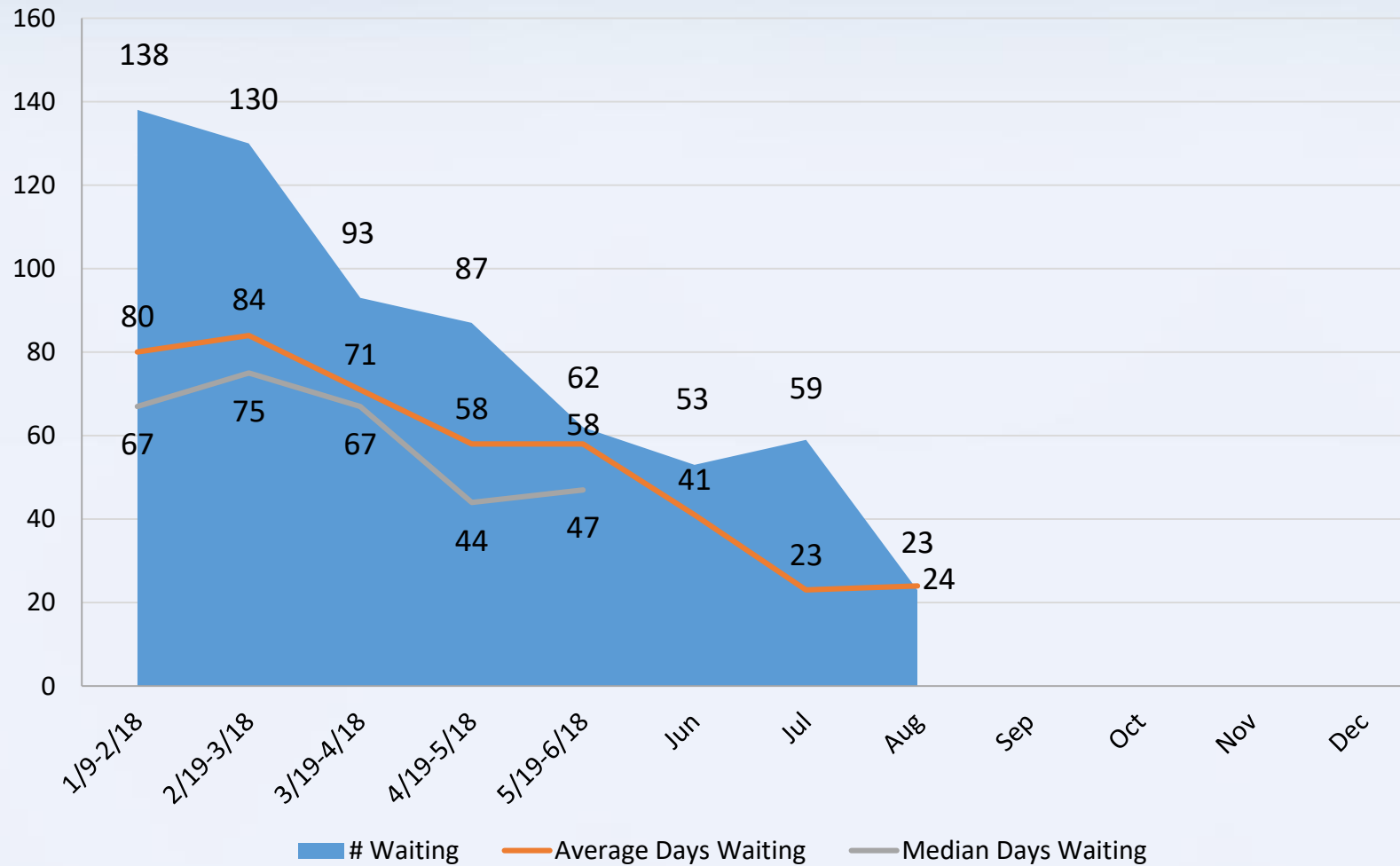
A family that has:

- A parent with an opioid-related S.U.D who is either actively using or is suspected of actively using
- A parent who has experienced an overdose or is suspected of experiencing an overdose
- Child(ren) have been, or are at high risk of, being taken into custody
- Had increased police contact and/or a family member with recent charges
- A history of Narcan use, or suspected Narcan use
- Experienced or are currently experiencing homeless, or are at risk of losing stable housing

Chittenden Hub Active Waitlist



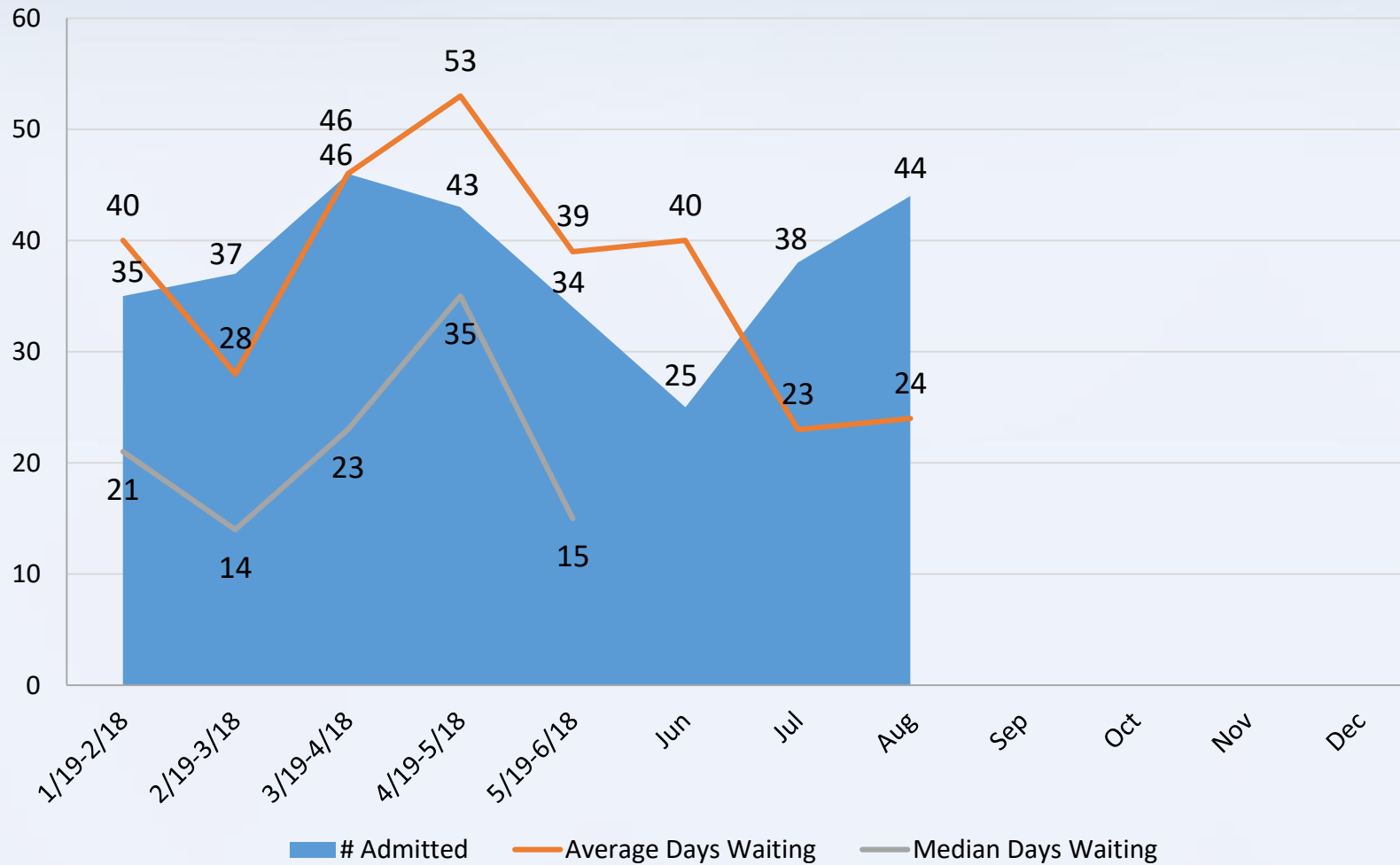
Chittenden Hub Active Waitlist # and Avg Wait Days

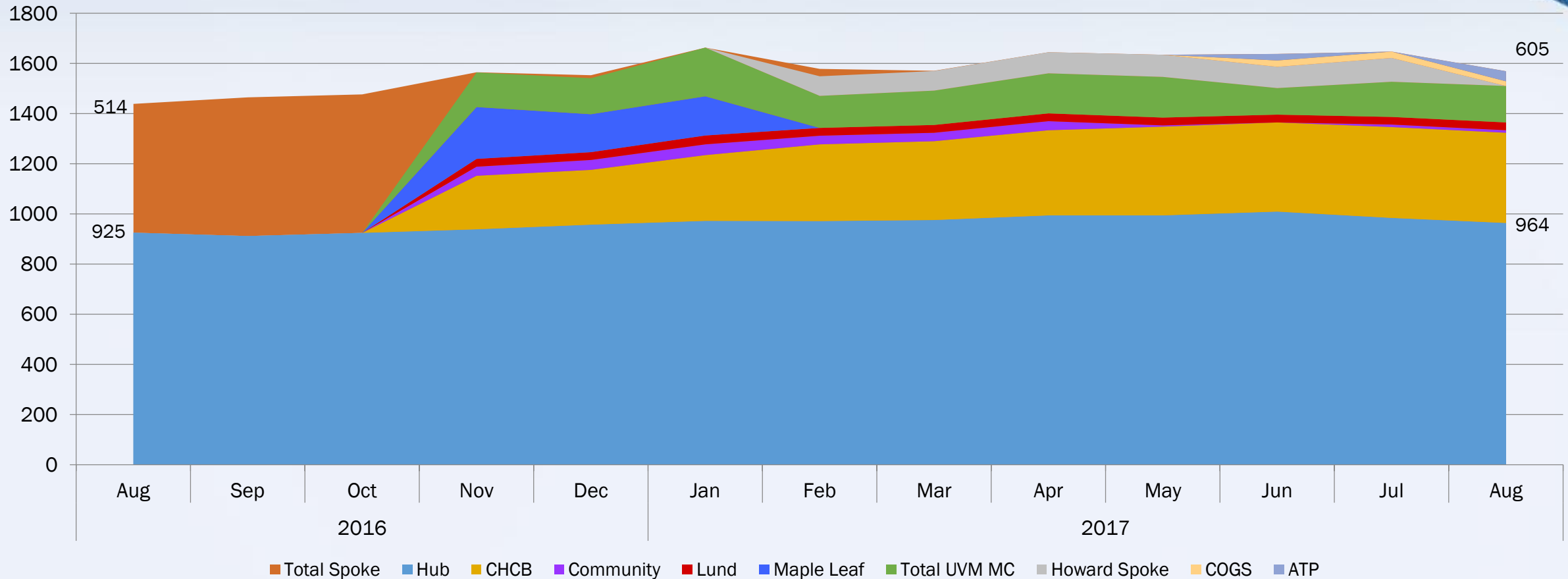

Number of People Treated in Hub & Spokes

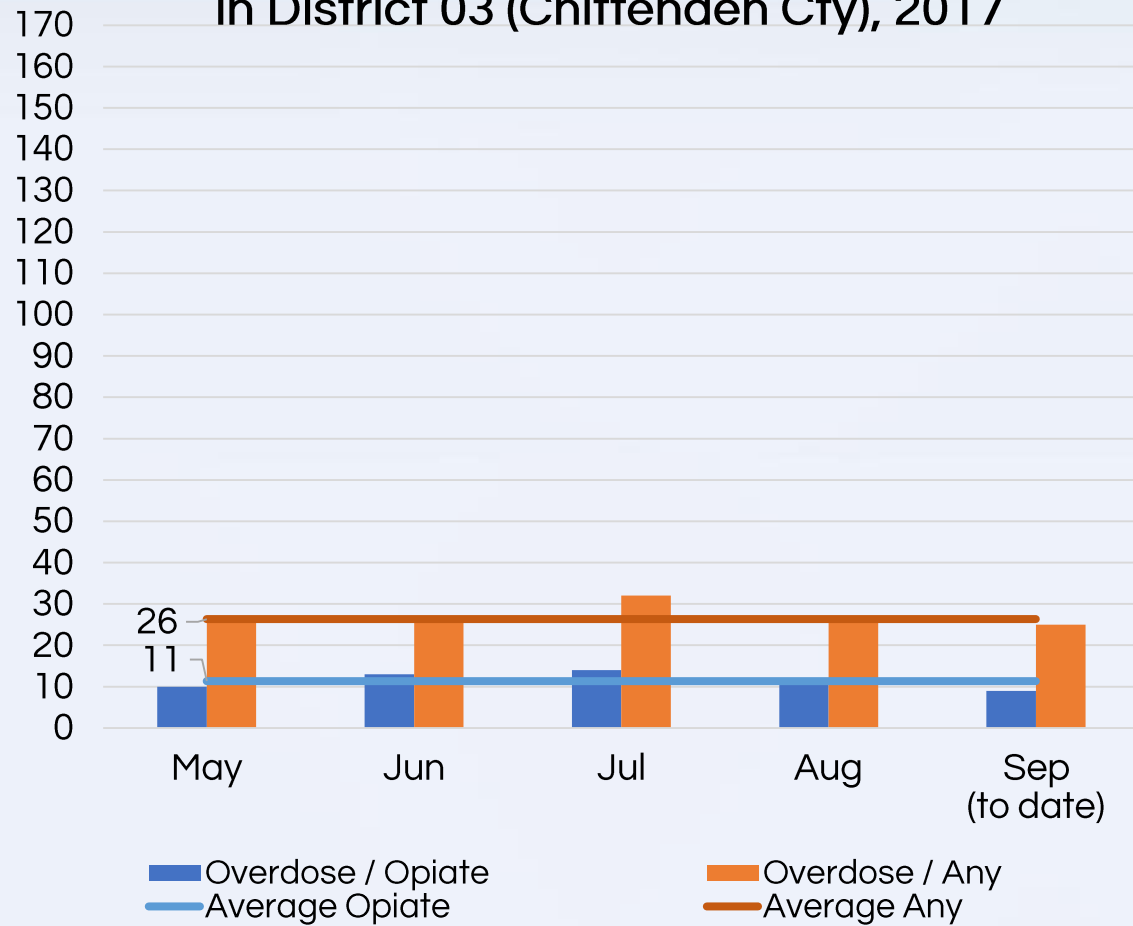

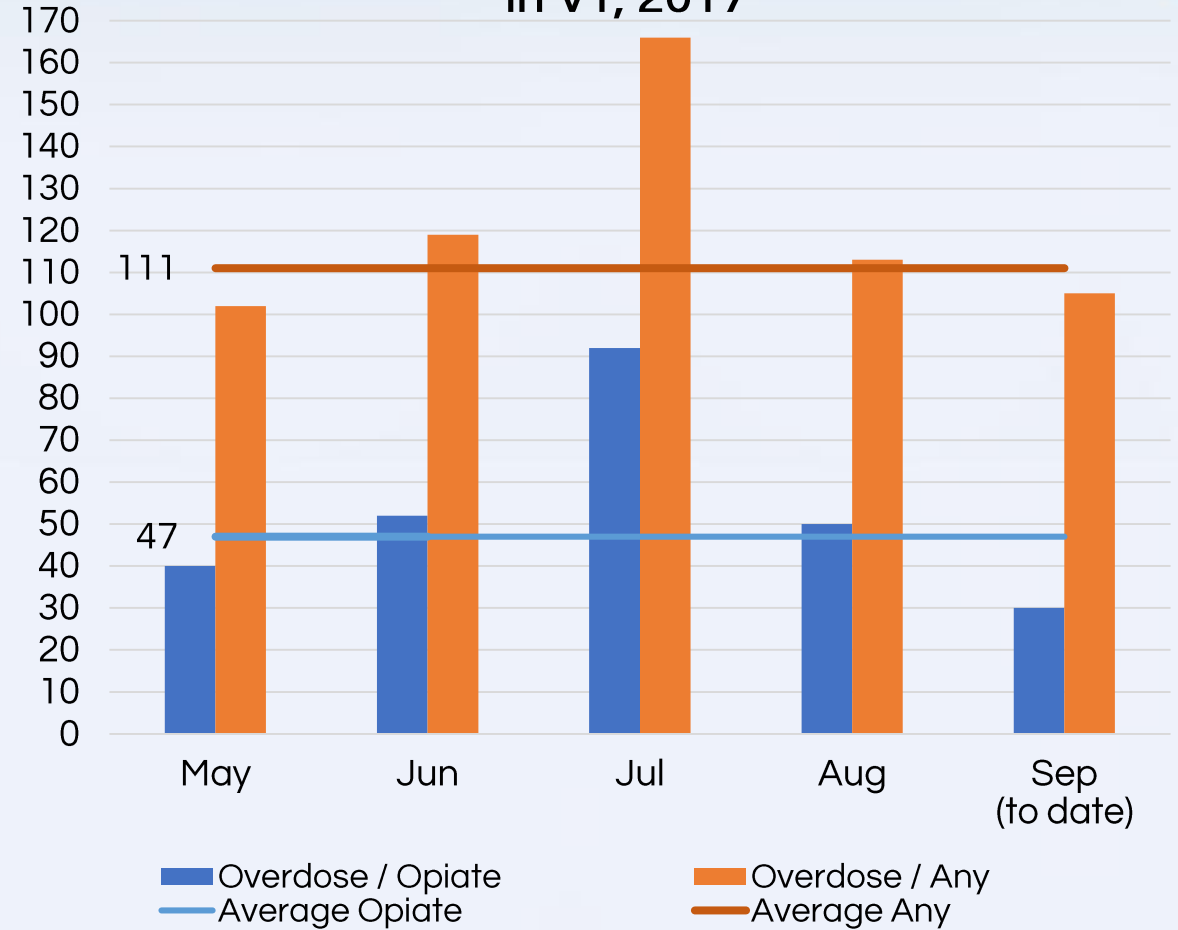


EMS Overdose Incident Responses

Monthly EMS Incidents with Primary Provider Impression of "Overdose / ..." in District 03 (Chittenden Cty), 2017



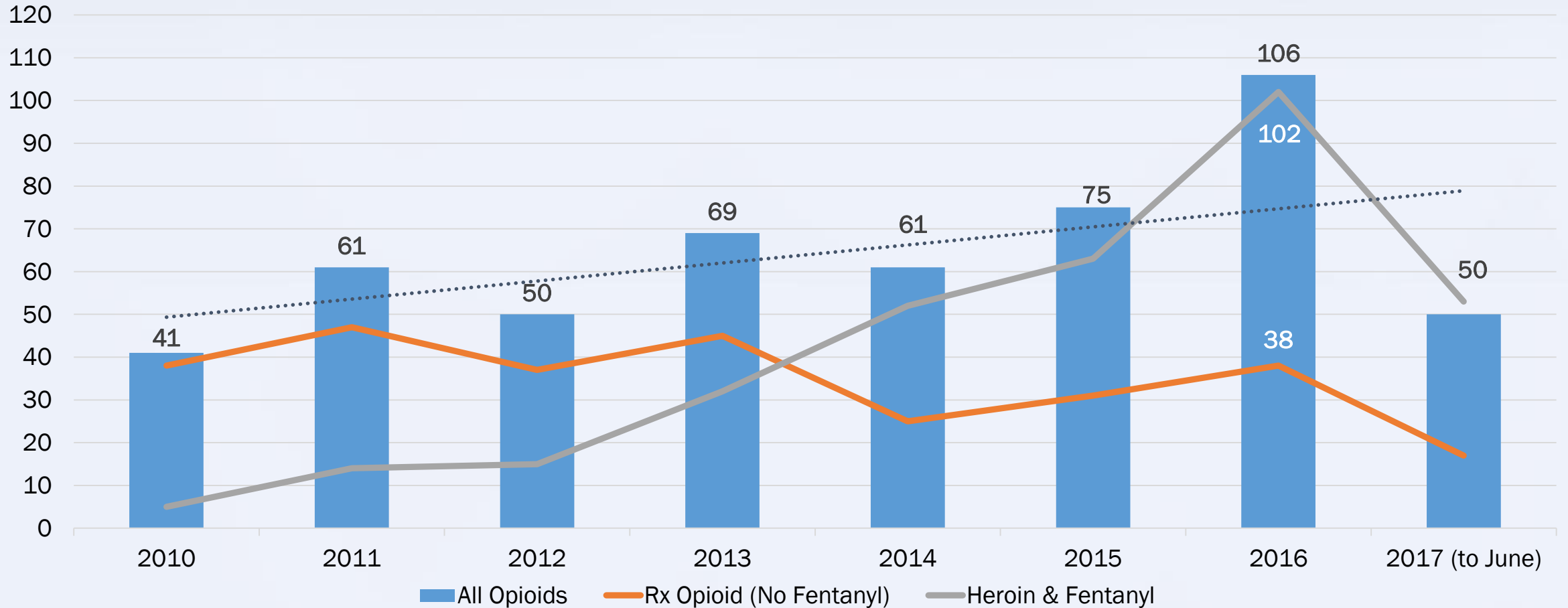
Monthly EMS Incidents with Primary Provider Impression of "Overdose / ..." in VT, 2017

Number of Accidental Fatal Overdoses Involving Opioids in Vermont by Opioid Type

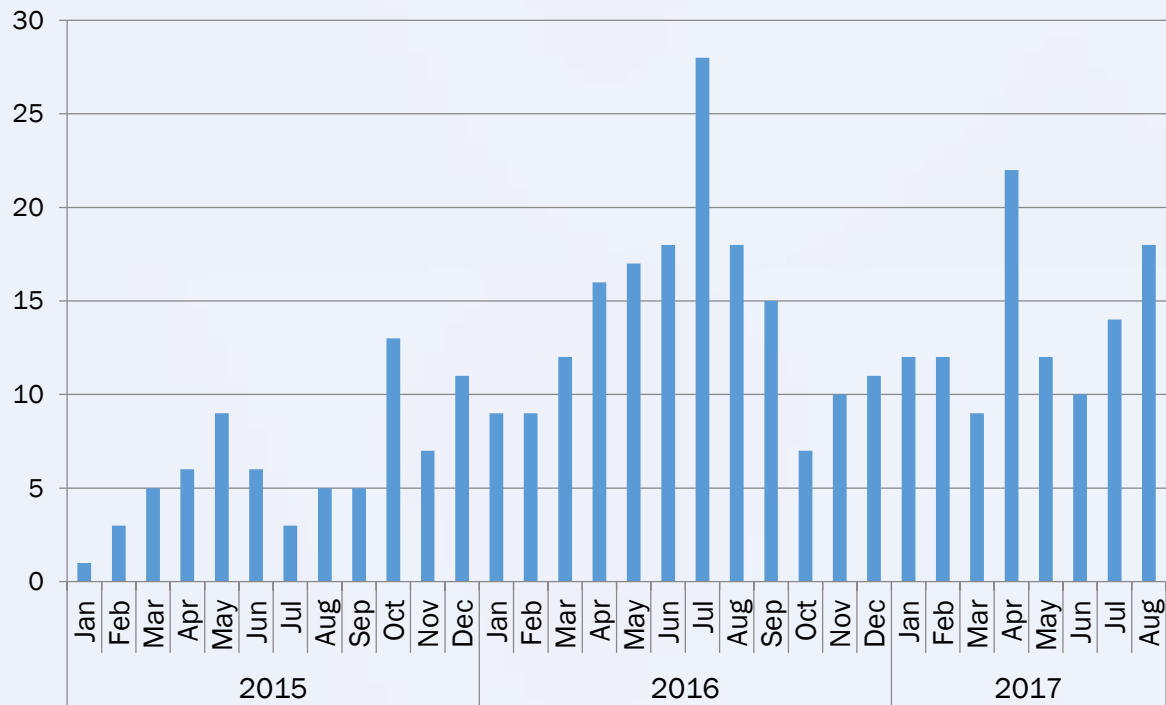

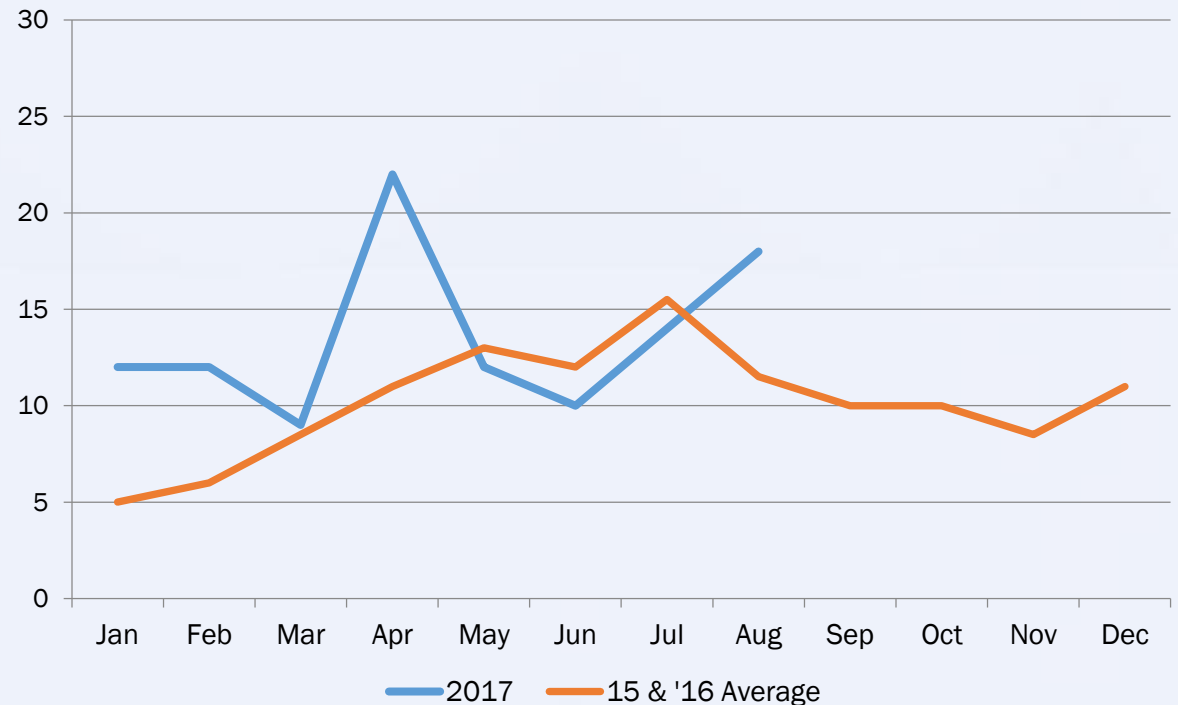
UVM MC Opioid Related ED Visits



Monthly UVM Medical Center ED Encounters Coded as "Opioid OD" & "Opioid Poisoning"



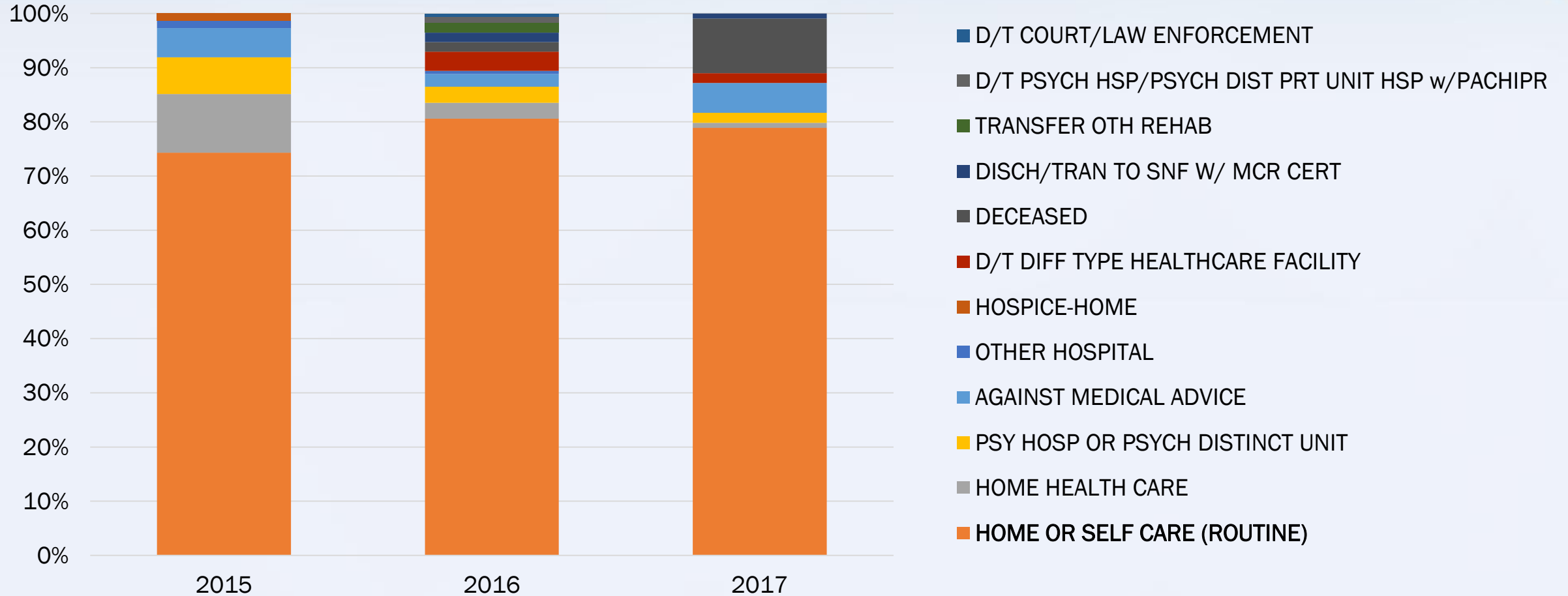
Average Monthly UVM Medical Center Opioid-Coded ED Encounters

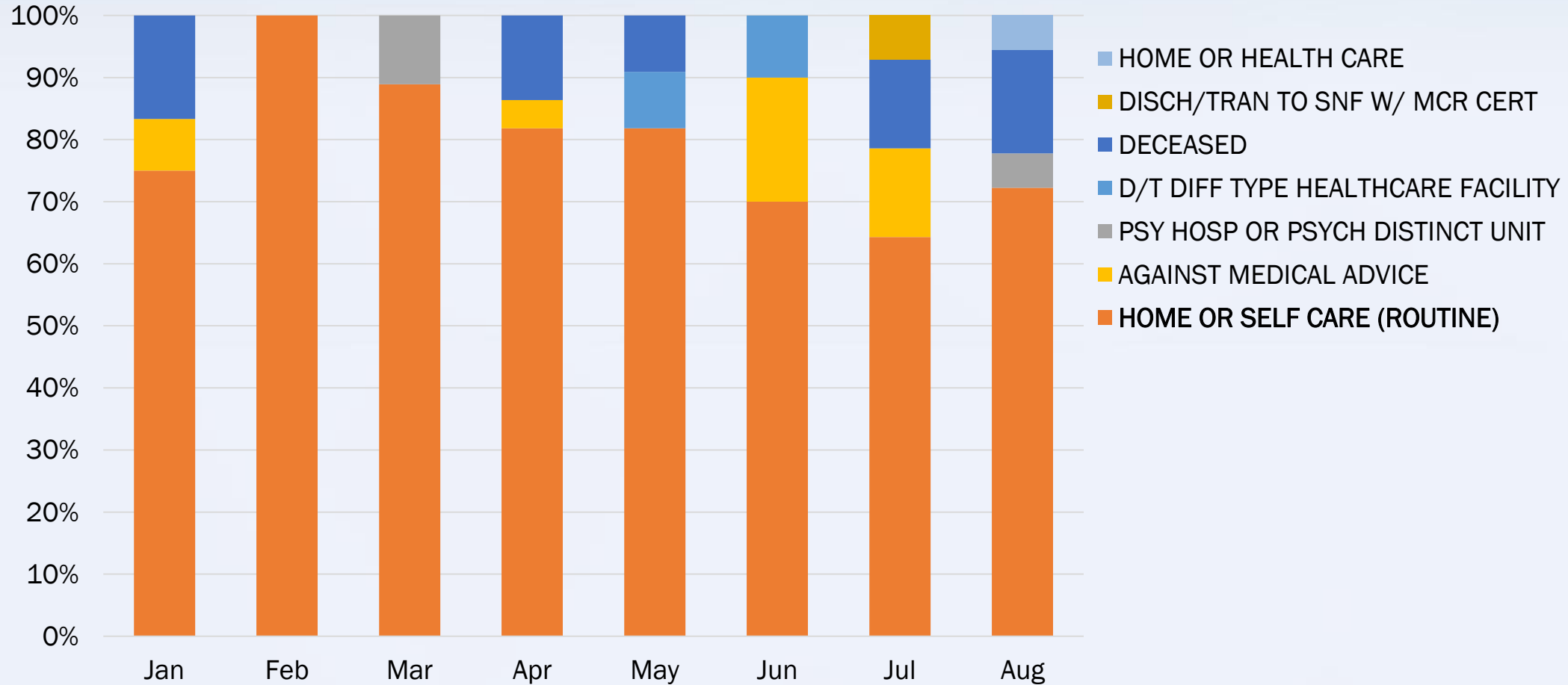
Discharge Disposition of UVM MC ED Encounters

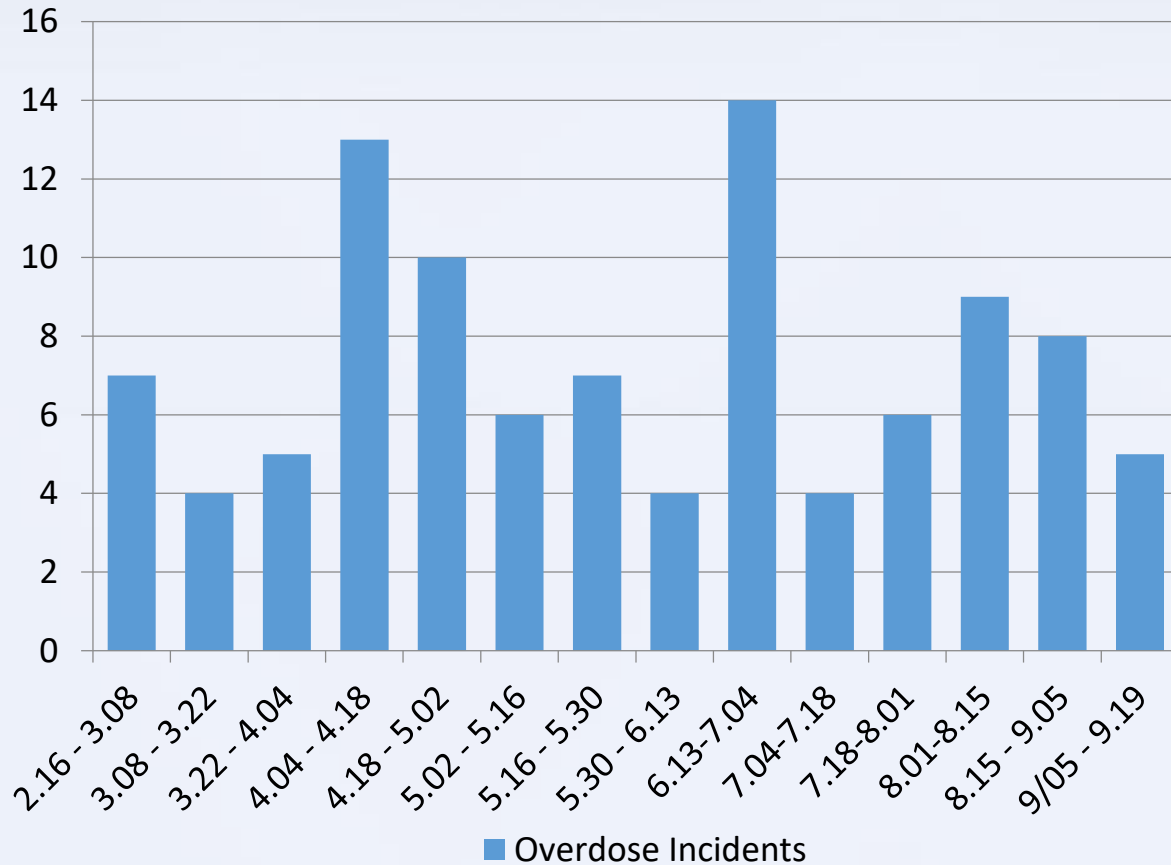
2017 Discharge Disposition of UVM MC ED Encounters
